Introduction

Notre Dame-Bishop Gibbons School is a regional school owned and operated by the Diocese of Albany. The traditions of the Christian Brothers and the Congregation of Notre Dame Sisters, the school's founding religious communities, are a vital part of the school's life and mission. It draws students from seventeen school districts in the counties of Albany, Fulton, Saratoga, Schenectady, and Montgomery. The school is accredited by the New York State Board of Regents and Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools.

Population

The student body is comprised of approximately 315 students in grades six through twelve. The student/faculty ratio is 11/1.

Academics

The academic program provides a solid foundation in the liberal arts with a strong emphasis on preparing students for college. The program follows the guidelines set out by the New York State Board of Regents. 65% percent of our students receive an Advanced Regents diploma and 35% percent receive Regents diplomas.

Students have the opportunity to take advanced courses for college credit in cooperation with University at Albany and Schenectady County Community College. In conjunction with the colleges, ND-BG presently offers Pre-Calculus, Calculus, English Composition (Grade 12), Spanish IV and Spanish V and Government.

Advanced Placement courses are offered in English, English Literature, European History, Psychology, Spanish, and U.S. History.

Course selections are determined by past academic achievement, teacher recommendations, and standardized test scores.

Grading/Class Rank

A numeric grading system is used.

- A = 90-100%
- B = 80-89%
- C = 70-79%
- D = 65-69%

A passing grade is 65% and above.

All subjects are included in the students' weighted average. Transfer students are not ranked.
